- Delivered weekly meals and food boxes to 100 of our neighbours and, finally, reunited around the table in December for a community dinner
- Facilitated neighbourhood food sharing through the Herb Box Project, partnering with Cultivate Festival
- Helped residents of a rooming house find beauty and connection by growing a vegetable garden amidst chaos and opposition



Our grassroots approach focuses on mobilizing the strengths of our community to find solutions to challenges.

- Adopted Asset-Based Community Development (ABCD) as central to our work, guided by international leader Cormac Russell and exchanging ideas through our Summer Learning Series
- Took a moment through the Loveseat Project to reflect on lessons learned from the pandemic and our values as a compassionate community that cares for one another.

CARING FOR ONE ANOTHER

A street-level approach to 'go-to healthcare' Drawing on relationships built over time, our focus was keeping people safe.

- Travelled with the health unit to get vaccines into arms
- Delivered harm reduction supplies in partnership with PARN in the face of the worsening drug poisoning epidemic
- Attended to health needs overlooked during the pandemic using a street-nursing approach

"People who use substances are faced with so much stigmatizing behaviour that it can prevent them from seeking the services they need. I don't think a lot of this population would have ended up getting immunized if we hadn't used this approach, and Green Wood was key in accomplishing what we did."

- Delivered art kits to people's doors and shared our finished work by mail through the "Postcard Exchange"

WORKING TOGETHER


Our community abounds in generosity
In 2021 community allies stepped up in countless ways.

- St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church and the County of Northumberland joined in operating day and nighttime warming rooms so no one would be left out in the cold
- Hundreds of folks from across the county rallied behind our Coldest Night of the Year fundraiser to help our most vulnerable neighbours, reaching our goal and then some
- A \$50,000 donation from Cameco Corporation and the proceeds from the Port Hope Tim Hortons Smile Cookie Campaign came at a time when the demands on our street outreach were never greater
- Finally, the gift of a greenhouse by Brookside School and a small "community build" to erect a memorial garden shed were meaningful contributions to the future of our garden as a place of healing



A Week on the Frontline

Green Wood staff are known to be flexible and creative in the way that they care for our community. Joyce Lichtenberger, one of our Community Outreach Workers, offers this glimpse into her day-to-day.

- I gave a man a ride to work and I listened as he explained his situation, having worked all summer and being ripped off for his pay.
- I brought a prospective new member on a "ride along" to show her what my typical day looks like, and I found myself saying over and over, "I don't really know how to explain what I do." So I just kept doing it.
- I joined the art group that was trying to figure out COVID rules around gathering indoors. So we built a fire outside, broke bread, shared some ideas and stories and called it a day. No solid answers but a good sense of belonging happened there.
- I picked up fresh food boxes and delivered them, taking time to visit, sharing stories, listening to concerns and sharing some hugs. Brought a warm coat to

a man who needed one. It wasn't new and it wasn't really his colour, but he was grateful and warm.

Having spent my week feeling that I can't really fix, solve or accomplish anything fully, I dropped in on a friend we support with a bag of bologna and bread. I sat and chatted with him for a while, and when I got up to leave, he took my hand and, with tears in his eyes, told me that our check-in visits are his favourite and best times. He said that he's grateful to have someone who cares about him because that means everything.

Then I realized, in all of this unexplainable mishmash of reaching out to take hands, filling plates, warming up cold bodies and solving small problems, much was accomplished. People were cared for, hands were held, thoughts were expressed – and heard – and there was Community in that kindness.

BECAUSE OF YOU....

In 2021 we put more outreach and peer support staff on the street, delivered more meals to those who were hungry, expanded our capacity for addiction recovery and harm reduction programs and operated day and night-time warming rooms so no one would be left out in the cold. **Because of you**, those who were hurting, unseen and alone, experienced kindness and human connection.

Thank you for making ours a community of hope.
